\*Discussion\*

1. Prof. Oluwatope started the meeting at 12:23 PM with greetings and an inquiry about the progress made by the literature review team headed by Prof. Bakare.
2. Prof. Bakare gave an update about the process and the current status of activities.
3. Prof. Oluwatope presented a document that clearly explains the types of literature review and their features.

4. There was deliberation on the literature review type that best fits the purpose of the project.
5. Two major review methods (narrative and critical) were identified after a thorough evaluation of the objectives of literature review for research.
6. Dr. Diyaolu proposed a combination of review methods. Research members approved of this suggestion.
7. Prof. Bakare, the leader of the literature review team, directed that the process be split into two between the textile and computing fields.
  - a. The textile team is to get and review publications that relate to the first part of the comprehensive desk-based study of the research proposal - “.. This will be done to analyze the evolution and dynamics of Nigeria’s textile and fashion design industry in the last three decades...”
  - b. The computing team is to handle the critical review aspect. “.. The desk-based research will emphasize the specific aspects in which cloud computing, Internet of Things, Big Data, Augmented Reality, Simulation, Additive Manufacturing, System Integration, and Cybersecurity can be deployed to transform the textile and fashion industries and related industries as well as value creation processes...”
8. Updates were made to the document on “Protocol for Comprehensive Desk Review” to reflect major decisions made at the meeting.
9. Prof. Bakare promised to send an updated list of “search strings” to be used in the search for relevant publications.
10. The review teams are expected to have a presentable result before the next meeting.

11. The next meeting is scheduled to be held on April 6, 2022.
